We got opinions about the improvement, upgrades, and a new instrument described below: (Improvement) introducing the queue system; archive (Upgrades) SCExAO, IRCS, COMICS, HDS (New instrument) a wide-field imaging polarimeter  We note that many of us at the workshop are interested in COMICS and IRCS, so it would be better for Subaru <i>not</i> to decommission these instruments. Comments on the Subaru WS support program (if any)	One of the senior representatives from potential partnership countries/regions/organization encourages Subaru and the Japanese community to have more workshop like ours this ti me for a variety of research fields.
